What Are We Building?

Recently, my family returned from a wonderful (and very humid) trip to Washington DC. I had not been there since I was a child and had forgotten the sheer scale of all the federal buildings and monuments that adorn Capitol Hill. It's hard not to be impressed by something like the Capital Dome or the Lincoln Monument- not just because of the lovely aesthetics and craftsmanship, but even more so because of what, as Lincoln said, they represent: A government of the people, by the people, for the people.

That being said, it's important to also remember that at the end of the day, these monuments are just things. They may represent people, but they are not themselves alive. And whether they truly mean anything really has more to do with how we build up the living people they represent than what we do to the unliving stones we so often admire. That's not to say that we should let our beautiful monuments crumble, but it is to say that ultimately a nation is defined by its people, not its things.



Yet it is fair to say that as human beings we are often more enamored with building up things than people. Many cities will much sooner fund a high-end stadium than build affordable housing apartments. And this is despite the fact that many places have massive problems with homelessness.

So let it be known that this does not just apply to Keith, but to all.


It is through the work of Christ that all are welcome. And welcome back if you've been gone for a while. We are always happy to see you!

Sadly, neither are religious communities immune. Recently I learned of a church-run private high school in another state that moved into an ornate new complex, complete with a golden dome. It cost 38 million dollars to build. This is a school that purports to be based on Christian values, which hopefully they do teach in many ways. And yet none of these millions have gone towards assisting poorer students with the \$5000/year tuition, which I'm told is a detail that has not been lost on the local community.

In a certain sense, you could say that one of the big spiritual reforms Jesus pushed for was a shift of focus from things to people. When many religious folks were willing to neglect struggling people for the sake of attending to buildings and strict rulebooks, Jesus offered a different vision for spiritual life.

For instance, the disciples liked to praise the beauty of the Temple building, yet Jesus stated that what God truly seeks are those who "will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth…" Likewise, when Jesus and his followers were criticized for breaking the religious codes by harvesting on the Sabbath, Jesus responded, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath."

The message is clear: God is more concerned with people than things- even religious things.

So as we gear up for a new school year and a busier season of life and ministry, it is good for us to remember this teaching. It's nice to build visually beautiful things, especially if they can be a blessing to our community. But it's much more important to build spiritually beautiful people, who can truly bless this world by bringing God's love near.

I am thankful for each of you and the ways you help us build up Christ's body in this place!


